AFTERNOON STUDY & WORK PROGRAMME (15 HOURS PER WEEK)

Course Aim

To help students develop their general English speaking, reading, writing and listening skills so they can live, work, study and travel successfully in the English speaking world.

Course Description

This course is for students studying for 25 weeks for 15 hours per week in afternoon classes. It is open to all levels and on completion of this course students take one of the following internationally recognised exams, please see the list below.

On arrival, students are placed in the appropriate level of General English classes according to their placement test. During the first week, students have a special induction meeting with a member of staff to discuss their course and which exam they will take at the end of their stay.



Students progress is monitored carefully and students regularly review their learning plan with teachers. When they have reached their required level, students can transfer to the relevant exam course. Students register for their chosen exam directly with CEC.
