

MORNING STUDY & WORK PROGRAMME (20 HOURS PER WEEK)

Course Aim

To help students develop their general English speaking, reading, writing and listening skills so they can live, work, study and travel successfully in the English speaking world.

Course Description

This long-term course is designed for students studying 25 weeks at 20 hours per week in morning classes. It is particularly popular with non-EU students who wish to come to Ireland on a long-term study visa.

On arrival, every student completes a placement test to ensure they join the right level of General English. In their first week, students also take part in a dedicated induction session with a member of our team. This provides guidance on their course, the immigration process, and support in choosing the most suitable end-of-course exam.

This 8-month visa programme includes 25 weeks of classes and 8 weeks of holidays. Students can work 20 hours per week during term and 40 hours per week during holidays. CEC also supports students with Jobs Club, CV clinics, and free career workshops.
