What is Frasmus+

Erasmus+ is the European Union's programme to support education, training & upskilling by providing fully funded opportunities to participate in international exchanges & programmes. Academic, teaching & admin staff from a range of education sectors, particularly higher education, are eligible to avail of **staff mobility** grants to take part in short-term further training courses as the courses offered in Cork English College.

How does the funding work?

Funding for any Erasmus+ course can be received by applying through your academic or higher education institution for a grant. As the receiving institution, Cork English College can provide or complete the necessary documents such as the Staff Mobility for Training invitation, Europass, and Certificate of Participation.



Applying for an Erasmus+ Staff Mobility grant can be a straightforward and certainly worthwhile process. If you wish to apply for an Erasmus+ grant, the first step is to contact your institution's International Office or Erasmus+ Coordinator for more information. Alternatively, you can contact your country's National Agency for advice & assistance.

ACCOMMODATION OPTIONS

Host Family

Availability: All Year Round

Description: This type of accommodation is arranged on a half-board basis from Monday to Friday and full-board at the weekend. Students will have their own bedroom and shared bathroom facilities. We always aim to accommodate only one student of the same mother tongue per house.



PARTICIPANT PATHWAY

CEC is an Online Testing School

We ask all new students to take our online placement test before travelling to Ireland. This allows our academic team to place you in the correct level and take you to class immediately on your first day. A member of the academic team monitors all tests and is available if you need help or have any questions.

Participants First Day

We ask participants to arrive at our Adult Centre by 8.45 am on their first day for a welcome presentation with the CEC team where participants receive important information about the school and their timetable. Participants who have taken the online test are taken directly to class to meet their teachers. CEC's classes follow the Council of Europe Common European Framework for Languages (CEFR) and we offer classes from A2 to C2.

Progress

Our qualified and experienced teachers use a variety of published and authentic materials to help participants progress as quickly as possible. Teachers and academic management meet regularly to discuss each student's progress. Each week the teachers hold a short meeting with each student, giving feedback and advice on how to improve. There is also a brief progress test each Friday. When a student is ready to move up to the next level, they will join their new class on Monday.

Methodology

The method of teaching used at CEC is the communicative approach. Our aim is to enable students to communicate more effectively in English both with native speakers and speakers of English from other countries. CEC's courses include work on grammar, vocabulary, pronunciation, and the skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing. Special emphasis is given to communicating effectively and accurately, and error correction plays an important role in classes. All of our course levels are mapped to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages and have clear learning outcomes. These learning outcomes are what the students can do with the language. Participants can see the learning outcomes for each week on the scheme of work in their classrooms and can discuss these with their teachers.

Participants can use the school common room & lounge area in the afternoons to relax, mingle with friends or use for study & work. Alternatively they can join our wide range of free & paid activities many of which are built into each Erasmus+ programme.

All participants have access to CEC Online, our integrated E-Learning platform. CEC Online is accessed through www.corkenglishcollege.com and offers students thousands of additional learning excercises as well as the ability to view & register for our weekly activity & social programme.

Course Certificate

On completion of the course, participants will receive a CEC Course certificate. An academic report is also sent to the student's CEC Online account. Any necessary documentation for Erasmus+ funding can be submitted to the main reception at the beginning of a participants week, and collected on their final day.




































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
